- Sports are back cross country, students made it to the Boards, volleyball tournament, Boys moved on to RFH. Grade 4-8 chess tournament is tomorrow.
- Health & Well Being over the PA system, take a minute to just breath every afternoon. Children love it and wait for it.
- Bullying awareness retreat
- Peel Public Health Clinic was offered to parents at the school for routine vaccines.
- Grade 7 & 8 Ottawa video information night registration closes December 13, 2022. School will send reminders to parents.
- Christmas break starts Friday, December 23rd and back at school on Monday, January 9, 2023.
- Spirit week during last week of December. Details to come.
- FDK will be doing a Christmas Concert.
- Every class will be given \$5 per student (funded by the school) to create a Christmas craft.
- Grade 8 Girls night is March 23^{rd,} Boys night is the week of April 17th. Guest speaker to Cruisers (wheel chair bound gentleman – will play basketball.)
- Pizza lunches will continue into new year.
- Outdoor equipment was purchased for recess time.
- The school provides funding for buses to attend mass, taxis for events. School has purchased new headsets and microphones.
- School yard pavement was fixed to address unpaved area where portables were removed.
- Parents are reminded to pick up children at the gates.
- Fire drills and lockdown procedures continue to be practiced.
- Busing Zone 3 If buses are canceled due to weather.
 No hybrid classes will be done. Hot lunches and pizza will be rescheduled.
- EQAO data was released. Students in Grad 3 & 6 received reports at home. Grade 3's (now Grade 4) reading 88.5% province 73.1%, writing 75% province 64.9% math 72.5% province 59% Grade 6's (now Grade 7) reading 90.1% prov 84.9%, writing 88.7% prov 84.7% math 36.6% prov 47%
- School safety was brought up by Melina entrance points at the school yard. Staff is present in the yard, but not necessarily at the entrances. Mr. Torres has said that changes have been made. Staff have shifted out towards those entrances. Mr. Torres stressed that he and Ms. Sodhi are always available and parents can always come in and speak to them about any concerns they have. Parent volunteers are welcome to come and

help out during the yard. Suggestion was provided in that kids could go straight inside instead of school bell start. Will keep things as is for now.

<u>Graduation Update</u> – Teacher Grad Committee – R. Zingaro, F. Cataldo, S. Alvaro & A. Coward

- Graduation ceremony is June 22, 2023.
- Historically the graduation ceremony is held at Robert F. Hall (RFH) but with the larger student classes this has presented as a concern due to limited space at RFH to invite extended family members. The past 2 years there the space presented as a fire hazard with no standing room available. This year it was decided to host the ceremony event offsite. This years pre-dinner (for students) and ceremony will be held at Royal Ambassador in town located on Innis Lake Rd. Graduates will attend mass at St. Johns Parish from 1-2pm, students will be bused to Royal Ambassador from mass at 2:30pm.
- A buffet dinner will be provided to students at Royal Ambassador with the ceremony to follow at 5-7pm will be the graduation ceremony.
- Gowns will be sent directly to the hall.
- Graduation cost to parents is \$118.59 per student for venue services & meal, awards, gowns.
- Parent engagement \$500 given from the Board for a parent night or guest speaker. Council to present ideas to use this money.

 with an instrument in hand.

- Maker space has been increased to include a Robotic mouse, Autobots, Makey Makey, Microbits. Recently spent \$1558.84 with Board Funding and book fair funds
- All staff is being trained on robotics. Teachers are becoming more knowledgeable about robotics.
 Connected with other schools to compare what they are using.
- Request to CSC is \$3,500.00 for 4 more items and additional coding robotics.

Chair's Report	 Graduation sweatshirt update - All board tendered vendors (3 in total) provided quotes. Merchant's was the successful vendor as they will be honouring last year's price of \$29.55/per sweatshirt with taxes in. Council has allocated \$35 for each sweater. With the \$10 surplus of funds the remaining budget can be put towards gown rentals. CSC will vote on this recommendation. Mr. Cataldo will be conducting a survey with the Grade 8s to select sweater design from a list of 10, with a final survey to select from top 2 choices. Merchants has allowed us to submit 2 designs of choice at no additional cost. Hot lunch program update was provided. Spirit wear update - The vendor can open an online Store for parents to order for spirit wear. Can increase price by 15% for school fundraising. Council members agreed to take 15%. Will go online in new year. Sport uniforms update. Vendor said he would provide a quote. Mr. Torres provided an update from staff that uniforms are still in good condition and it was unnecessary to get new ones.
