We continue to respect and accommodate those who choose to wear a mask. Any student who travels outside of Canada must wear a mask for 14 days while in school We are continuing to support hand hygiene, enhanced cleaning procedures throughout the school, etc. Visitors and volunteers are allowed back into our schools In-person meetings can take place, including parent council meetings Please continue to do screening in the morning prior to coming to school Student co-horting and physical distancing have been lifted Graduations are now back on Fundraising and Food Programs back on Parents have been given a choice as to whether they would like to take part in remote learning Athletics have started up. Intermediate and Junior basketball are currently taking place. Co-ed baseball, soccer and track and field for Junior and Intermediate students are upcoming. Staff must be willing to run these teams Chess clubs, games club, PALS program during recess times Girls Night In – 11 staff will facilitate the event – Grade 8 girls will be invited from 3:45 to 8:00 p.m. Guest speakers will also be invited. Students were provided with a survey about what they wanted to do. "Let the Light Shine" is the theme. There will be no cost to students as Foodland has graciously donated snacks. - Ukraine fundraiser has been going well. All funds will be sent to the Archdiocese of Toronto to be distributed.
- Cookies for ShareLife is taking place.
- Now that co-horting has been removed, students can now work together and help other students. Will be starting up "Angels" who will be mentors and work with other students at recess or in the classroom and be that extra-helping friend. This will be great for the Gr. 7 students as part of their sacrament community service.
- Easter Food Drive is currently taking place and will be given to the parish.
- Robert F. Hall students coming in they are called "Voices" – they will be speaking to our Gr. 8 students about leadership and empowering them with regards to equity and unity.
- Pizza lunch will be starting. Airport Pizza has been contacted and will likely be on Thursdays.
- Catholic Education Week is coming up in May.
- We have received a grant from the ministry for outdoor learning and part of that will be Scientists in the School.
- Journey into Learning for FDK students.
- Mrs. Ricitano will likely be hosting a book fair during Catholic Education Week
- EQAO will take place this Spring for Gr. 3-6. The test will take place online. Teachers will be taking part in training for this.
- Bus Cancellations Zone 3 if buses are cancelled schools are open. Combing classes is now a possibility on bus cancellation days since there is no longer a requirement for cohorting.
- RAZ Kids license will not be renewed. RAZ
 Kids may not be the best online literacy
 program. The board recommends Knowledge
 Hook, Spark, resources on Edwin platform,
 etc.
- Holy week is coming up April 10-14. Stations of the Cross will take place as a journey through Lent – possibly presenting the stations to the students in the Gym.
- Student assemblies took place this past week.
 Morning entry will now take place at 9:15

a.m. Students will be supervised outdoors starting at 9 a.m. There will be a teacher on duty at the Kiss and Ride, walkway and bus as well as on the playground. If it is raining, students will be able to come inside. During recess students can play on the field and on the pavement according to zones. There are intermediate, junior and primary zones. At dismissal, students picked up in the Kiss and Ride are dismissed five minutes early to make way for buses. There will also be an early bell for older siblings to pick up younger students from their class. No capacity limits in washrooms. Students are encouraged to continue to sanitize their hands. Murals – There was a sub-committee and ideas given by Mr. Stevenson for sensory path and learning commons. It was shared with co-chairs and staff. The front entrance has been painted white. April 4 is World Autism Day. The school has planned activities for the students around raising awareness about Autism. Parent request for education for parents as well, and resources will be sent out in school newsletter. **Graduation:** Gr. 8 Graduation ceremony will take place on Monday, June 27th at Robert F. Hall at 6 p.m. Students will go to school during the day. Students can bring outfits to school to change. Dinner and cake will take place in the gym for students – 4-5 p.m. There will be a fee for the dinner. Gowns are provided for students – there may be a fee Students will walk over to R.F. Hall Small liturgy by Father Bob – presentation – awards - etc. Refreshments provided to parents, staff and students in RFH foyer. Celebration at the Royal Ambassador is usually hosted by the Parent Council – not the school – parent chat group has been set up for this.
